2017 Fall Citizen Police Academy

ur philosophy of Community Oriented Policing in the City of Newark is producing many positive results. One of the most important outcomes is an increased awareness of the importance of an effective police – community partnership that includes open and honest communication. One of the goals of the Citizen Police Academy is to facilitate this partnership and to improve communication by developing a better understanding of each other's role in the community.

Your participation in the Citizen Police Academy not only be a positive learning experience for you, but it will also give us the opportunity to listen to your concerns and ideas. During the Academy, you will be exposed to many aspects of your police department and you will learn about the laws, procedures and policies that govern law enforcement. Our hope is that this course curriculum, coupled with the experiences of the students, will lead to lively and informative discussions about issues facing the City of Newark.

The Newark Police Department is your police department. By working together, we can solve many of the problems facing us today. Your participation in the Citizen Police Academy is one of the many ways that you can get involved in your community and contribute towards making a safer living environment.

The upcoming 2017 Fall Citizen Police Academy will be an eleven week course. Classes will meet on Wednesday evenings from 5:30 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. from August 16, 2017, through October 25, 2017.

Applicants MUST:

- Have no prior felony or serious misdemeanor convictions
- 2. Be willing to have a background check completed
- 3. Attend all scheduled sessions
- 4. Be at least 21 years old
- Live or work in the City of Newark
- 6. Not be a prior Newark CPA graduate

New Civic Center update

fter a lengthy and comprehensive procurement process, the City Council, at their April 27th meeting, selected the firm of Heller Manus Architects as the design architects for the new Newark Civic Center. Heller Manus has extensive experience creating civic and public buildings and has assembled an impressive team of consultants that includes experts in their fields. McClaren, Wilson & Lawrie, Inc., the consultant for the police building, has completed 275 public safety facilities across the nation. Safdie Rabines Architects. the consultant for the library, has completed several library and community room projects. Heller Manus designed the Hayward City Hall. Heller Manus Architects are committed to creating the right design for Newark that will showcase the community and provide greatly needed state-of-the-art police, library and City administrative buildings as well as outdoor gathering spaces. The design work is scheduled to begin this month.

The City recently contracted with Kier and Wright Civil Engineers and Surveyors, Inc. to complete the Boundary and Topographic Surveys and Underground Utility Locating Services of the current and future site of the Newark Civic Center. The work was completed in February 2017.

As was described in the Civic Center Feasibility Study completed last year, the new Civic Center will be located on the same site as the existing civic center. The current police, library and City administration offices will remain open throughout the construction process. The design of the overall Civic Center site will incorporate features that will allow City and library staff to continue to provide uninterrupted and quality service to the community during construction.

There will be a number of City Council and community workshops to review the design work as it progresses. The first workshop will occur during the summer of 2017. Brain health, aging and dementia

ognitive aging is a natural aging process; however, the effects on the memory may vary significantly among older individuals. Research shows that one in eight individuals over 65 and nearly half over 85 are affected with some form of Alzheimer's disease. The good news is that evidence shows that a positive lifestyle can reduce the risk of cognitive decline as well as dementia. For more information, please refer to the websites at www.alz.org.

In an effort to increase community awareness and education, the Tri-city Senior Focus Team, a group of commissioners and senior advisory council, have been advocating the Dementia Friendly Community (DFC) (www.dfamerica.org) and the Aging Friendly Cities (AFC) (www.who.int/ageing/publications), a project that supports active healthy aging.

A brain fitness program was also created by the focus team in partnership with other community institutions that include the Alzheimer's Association of Northern California, the Alzheimer's Association of the East Bay, Masonic Homes, and Washington Hospital with the Fremont, Newark, and Union City senior centers.

Transportation improvements

lameda County Transportation Commissioners recently approved the 2018 Comprehensive Investment Plan (CIP) earmarking \$405 million over the next five years for transportation projects and throughout programs Alameda County, including much needed safety and quality improvements along Thornton and Central Avenues, reflecting the city's commitment to providing safe and smooth roads for travel. CIP funding comes from a combination of local voter approved Measure B, Measure BB and Vehicle Registration Fee dollars as well as state and federal sources, and projects were selected from city submittals.

Construction on the Central Avenue Overpass Project, a fourlane bridge over railroad tracks in the Dumbarton area, is scheduled to begin in August 2018. The at-grade crossing will be replaced with a pedestrian and bike friendly bridge making this area safer for all modes of transportation.

The CIP investment leverages nearly \$2.8 billion of additional regional, state and federal funding, leading to a total investment of approximately \$3.2 billion worth of countywide transportation improvements — supporting access and local jobs.

"Alameda CTC is delivering on our promises – providing critical funding for a wide range of local transit, bike, pedestrian and highway and infrastructure improvement priorities to improve safety and state of good repair, and close gaps in our transportation system," noted Alameda CTC Chair and Oakland Councilmember Rebecca Kaplan.

Free paper shredding

Newark residents will have the opportunity to bring up to four boxes each (approximately 10"H x 12"w x15"D) of documents to a free shredding event hosted by the Newark Police Department and the Community Engagement Team on Saturday, July 29, 2017, from 10:00AM-2:00 PM in the City Hall parking lot. The event is only open to Newark, CA residents and businesses; identification and verification of residency is mandatory to participate (driver's license, utility bill etc.). Businesses will need to show a copy of their current City of Newark Business License. Please note: Your boxes of paper must be free of large binder clips, trash, light bulbs, and metal containers or scrap metal and food waste. Paper clips and staples are okay.

Please be advised that you are destroying documents at your own risk. It is your obligation to ensure that shredding/destruction of the documents complies with all applicable laws, rules, and regulations, including but not limited to rules and laws regarding confidentiality, retention, disposition, and destruction of information contained in the documents you wish to destroy. The City makes no representations and warranties regarding the applicability of those laws and at no point does the City become the owner of the documents you wish to shred/destroy
