RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK ADOPTING THE CITY OF NEWARK'S GREEN STORMWATER INFRASTRUCTURE PLAN

WHEREAS, the City of Newark's stormwater discharge requirements are regulated by the reissued Municipal Regional Stormwater Permit (MRP) adopted by the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board on November 19, 2015 (Order No. R2-2015-0049); and

WHEREAS, in order to comply with Provision C.3.j of the MRP, the City of Newark is required to prepare a Green Stormwater Infrastructure Plan for the inclusion of low impact development drainage design into appropriate projects on public and private lands to address the adverse water quality impacts and pollutants from urban stormwater runoff and urbanization; and

WHEREAS, as a milestone in the preparation of the Green Stormwater Infrastructure Plan, the City of Newark adopted a framework for Green Infrastructure Plan development on June 22, 2017 through Resolution No. 10,660; and

WHEREAS, a Green Stormwater Infrastructure Plan has been prepared that details a prioritization mechanism for planned or potential projects, establishes targets for impervious surface retrofit and pollutant load reduction, and includes standard and typical details adopted by the Alameda Countywide Clean Water Program in coordination with local jurisdictions;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE City Council of the City of Newark that the City Council does hereby adopt the City of Newark's Green Stormwater Infrastructure Plan attached to the staff report accompanying this Resolution as Attachment B.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Public Works Director, or designee, is authorized to update the Green Stormwater Infrastructure Plan, including maps and potential project locations, as necessary to maintain compliance with the MRP.
