On August 8, 2019, City officials along with representatives from Perkins & Will Architects and Webcor Builders broke ground to begin construction of the Newark Civic Center Project. This state-of-the-art complex will consist of a new City Hall, Library, and Police Building centered around an outdoor plaza.

Since construction is located adjacent to residential and commercial areas, our goal is to keep the public informed about what to expect as the project progresses. While the nature of our work comes with some unavoidable noise and ground disturbances, we do not want to discount that these factors will likely affect the people residing in the surrounding area.
