The City of Newark has received many complaints about Republic Services' service level. Main complaints address experiences in the delay of service pick-ups. In some cases, service is delayed for several days leaving trash carts out on the streets day-after-day until they are serviced. For some individuals, it's almost a regular expectation to receive a robo-call that their pick-up is going to be delayed. We've also received complaints of long wait times when calling Republic Services' customer service line and bulky-waste pick-ups that should have been scheduled, going unserviced.

We at the City of Newark feel your frustration and completely understand your concerns. We have been in constant contact with Republic Services and have been working with them to address these issues. Republic Services apologizes for the inconveniences you have been facing. Unfortunately, driver shortages caused primarily by COVID-19 and the required time off Republic Services' workforce needs to deal with exposures, infections, and vaccinations for themselves and family members is significantly impacting their service levels.

Republic Service informs us that the drivers who are working, are stretched covering additional routes and working overtime. They have been hiring additional drivers to help alleviate the additional time off requirements and tell us that they will continue to grow their workforce to meet the service needs.

We at the City assure you that we are working with Republic Services to address service needs and will continue to monitor the complaints we receive. We thank you for your patience and understanding.

The status of your zone will reflect if your zone has been impacted by an emergency incident.
