# **ARPA Recovery Plan**

n March 11, 2021, the Federal Government passed the American Rescue Plan Act, commonly referred to as "ARPA", a \$1.9 trillion relief package aimed to stimulate the economy. Under ARPA, the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (SLFRF) was established and \$11.8 million was awarded to the City of Newark.

The Newark City Council held a work session on October 7, 2021 to discuss options to spend the City of Newark's \$11.8 million allocation. The Council provided feedback to City staff and a proposed City of Newark ARPA Recovery Plan was developed.

\$4,857,000 is allocated towards personnel and operating budget restoration. Restoration will address critical needs of the City by providing for the return of prepandemic service levels and ensure that City services will continue to the foreseeable future.

The remaining balance of \$6,943,000 will be applied towards community projects that will help address negative economic impacts, build on infrastructure, apply to administration and public health, and

serve disproportionately impacted communities.

The Newark City Council adopted the recovery plan at the October 28, 2021 City Council meeting. City staff is already working on implementing many of these programs, including small business grants and other business assistance. # Safety tips

#### Auto Theft Prevention Tips:

- Never leave your car running and unattended
- Keep your vehicle locked at all times
- Never leave spare keys or valuables in your car
- Park in well-lit areas
- Install an anti-theft device if your vehicle does not have one:

*Audible and visible device* (i.e. horn alarm, steering-wheel locks, etc.)

*Immobilizing-type devices:* These prevent thieves from bypassing a vehicle's ignition system and hot-wiring the vehicle. Some incorporate computer chips in ignition keys or disable the flow of electricity or fuel to the engine (i.e. smart keys, fuse cut-offs, kill switches, wireless, ignition authentication).

*Vehicle Recovery Systems:* These devices use electronic transmission technology that help law enforcement reveal the location of stolen vehicles – and possibly catch the thief in the act.

- Do not leave your vehicle title in the car
- Do not leave keys to your home or garage door openers in your vehicle

# AC Alert

What is AC Alert? AC Alert is the Mass Notification System used by City and County agencies throughout Alameda County to rapidly disseminate emergency alerts to people who live, work in, or visit our County. AC Alert is capable of sending alerts by voice, text and email, as well as messaging Nixle subscribers, posting to social media pages, and sending FEMA Wireless Alerts (WEA).

The County of Alameda and our partner cities strongly encourage all who live, work in, or frequently visit Alameda County, to opt-in to the AC Alert system. When you register with AC Alert you can provide multiple methods of contact, including your cell, home and work phones, and email addresses. You can designate multiple locations in Alameda County where you want to receive emergency alerts. Additionally, you can sign up for community subscription topics offered by participating jurisdictions.

To make sure we can reach you in an emergency, when you need to take protective actions, register with AC Alert at *www.acalert.org*.

### Holiday tree collection

Republic Services offers FREE holiday tree collection and recycling to Newark residents! From January 11 to January 24, 2022, you may place your tree in the street at the curbside for pick-up on your regular collection day. Just remember to remove all ornaments, tinsel, tree stand, and other decorations before placing your tree at the curb. Trees may also be cut into small pieces and placed in your green organics cart (black trash cart if flocked). Trees taller than 5' must be cut down. Trees may also be dropped off between December 27, 2021, through January 10, 2022, at Republic Services located at 42600 Boyce Road in Fremont at no cost for green trees or a \$5 fee for flocked trees. Check in with the receptionist; proof of Newark residency is required. If you have any questions, please call Republic Services at 510-657-3500.
