Housing Element

This year, Newark is updating its Housing Element, a plan for all the housing needed in the community, and you have a once in a decade opportunity to help shape the future.

All cities and counties in California are required to adequately plan to meet the housing needs of everyone in the community by adopting a Housing Element as part of their General Plan. The City's General Plan guides all the ways the city is planned and managed – from our roads and sidewalks to our parks and neighborhoods. State law requires that our Housing Element be updated every eight years. This year's effort will update the city's housing policies and actions, as well as identify locations, housing types, and number of homes to be accommodated (but not necessarily built) by 2031.

We encourage you to join this opportunity to share your input on housing in the places you live, work, and love by participating in our online community conversation about housing. Provide your feedback by taking our brief community survey in multiple languages. Your participation will help us develop a 2023-2031 Housing Element with proactive solutions to build a more inclusive and affordable future for everyone.







Ohlone Community College

With cases of COVID-19 exposure in the region continuing to decline, Ohlone Community College is pleased to announce that in-person classroom instruction has returned to both the Newark and Fremont campuses for the Spring 2022 semester.

The eco-friendly Newark Center for Health Sciences and Technology opened in 2008 as the first “green” community college campus in the nation. A variety of programs and courses are offered during the day, at night, and on the weekends to accommodate

student schedules. Program offerings include: Biotechnology, Environmental Studies; Physical Therapist Assistant; Registered Nursing; and Respiratory Therapist. An array of general education, fitness and wellness courses are also available.

Although the Spring 2022 semester has already kicked off, it is not too late to sign up for classes. There are still many available, including tuition-free noncredit Late Start Classes in March and April. Students can learn in-person, online and/or in a hybrid format. Depending on the class, you can

earn 0.5 to 4 units per class.

If you need technology or equipment support, Ohlone College offers students equipment such as laptops, Wi-Fi hotspots and webcams as well.
